A message from our pastor, Rev. Dr. Daniel Wonderly: "What is Your Treasure?"

Dear Members of Faith.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke about two treasures (Matthew 6:19-20). We either seek "treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal" or "treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal."

We are all treasure seekers because we either want to enjoy treasures on earth or treasures in heaven. Our choices, decisions, and actions are dictated by what we hold dear. What we treasure dictates how we think about ourselves and our relationships with others and most importantly, with God. So what is your treasure? What causes you to love the treasures or the things of this world or the treasure that God offers?

Later in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money" (verse 24).

Jesus is telling us that either God or money will be our treasure and become the master in our hearts. We are told that we can't serve both God and money. In this verse, Jesus points out that money above everything else can keep our hearts from making Him our treasure. How then, can our hearts be set to treasure Jesus above all else?

Think of the parable Jesus once told: "The kingdom of heaven is like

treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." And recognize that we are the "treasure" in this story, and Jesus is the One, who "sells all that he has and buys that field."

Jesus treasured us so much that he gave away his life on the cross, in order to purchase our salvation at the price of his blood. That's how precious we are to our Lord, and this joyful knowledge transforms our hearts to treasure Jesus above all the treasures of the world. And Jesus is the only treasure that "neither moth nor rust destroys!" He is eternal life!

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES 04.17.2024

Opening Prayer: Given by Pastor Dan. Approval of Minutes: Motion made by Lyle Hackler to approve minutes as submitted, seconded by Pastor Dan; motion carried. Approval of Treasurer's **Report:** Theresina reports everything is balanced and quarterly statements went out. The Capital Campaign balance \$195,138.48. We have raised \$2,065.00 for the organ so far. Motion made by Pastor Dan to approve treasurer's report as submitted, seconded by Bill Musser; motion carried. Request from Sharon Volrath: Theresina Girard-Schmidt received a request from Sharon Volrath to give a glass communion set to Rev. Dustin Ridings at Zion Lutheran Church in Oconto WI. Motion made by Pastor Dan to gift this glass communion set to Zion Lutheran Church in Oconto, WI, seconded by Lyle Hackler; motion carried. Pastor's Report: Pastor is waiting to hear back from Pastor Pat Simmons to see if he can cover for him while he's on vacation; Jack Halbleib and Jerry Hallman will also cover. Confirmation went well this past Sunday and was well attended. Thank You to Theresina and Scott Schmidt delivered the pulpit to Orphan Grain Train on Tuesday, April 9th – thank you both for a wonderful outreach. Faith Lutheran (FLY): Youth Report Rachael Simmerman reports the Youth is hosting the Congregational Campfire on May 18th, and they went bowling 2 weeks ago. The last day for Sunday School is May 5th and they are looking at possibly changing the name, giving it a new face, and encouraging more involvement. VBS plans are possibly going with one day in June for ages 3 to grade 6. The Thrift sale is on Saturday, May 18th. If you have anything you'd like to donate

for this sale, please drop them off at church and we ask that you please mark prices on the items. Preschool went to Children's Museum this week with funds being donated for this trip and next they will be going to Irvine Park. Preschool Graduation is May 14th and 15th at 9:30 a.m. The Youth online Clothing Fundraiser is going along well this is through The Chippewa Store. The Quillow project is on hold until next fall as volunteers are needed for this project. Faith Lutheran Church Survey (FLC): Bill Musser handed out the final copy for Council to review. They will be doing marketing first to give members a "heads up" that this survey will be coming out and would like to have this completed within 2 weeks after it's released. Synod Capital Campaign -"Labor of Love": Jack Halbleib reminded Council that this campaign starts in the fall. We are looking at doing a "free will" offering every 4th Sunday to support this effort. A notice will be in the Newsletter and on screens.

M&M Council Responsibilities: Finance/Budget Theresina _ Girard-Schmidt, Jack Halbleib: further additions. Human Resources -Jack Halbleib: No report. Stewardship/Time & Talents - Kathy Butak: There are no openings left on the church directory photo schedule and approximately 10 families submitted photos. We are in need of a handicapped walker. If anyone has one that they'd like to donate, please contact the church office. Facilities -Lyle Hackler: Bartingale came out and adjusted the Boiler program so alarms don't keep going off, costing \$240.00 to fix this. There's a hole above the kitchen in the roof cap and it was leaking through. Balts Construction looked at it and will replace it at no charge. Overhead Screen Projector: Pastor states a member has offered a \$500.00 donation for this project and feels we should move ahead as the current unit is running on borrowed time. All Council members were in agreement with plans to move forward with this project. Lyle Hackler states the facilities team is willing to be on the committee as they have already discussed this project and

are on top of things. To date, we have a total of \$1,200 committed so far for this project. Evangelism Theresina Girard-Schmidt: The Lenten meals went well. From the donations that came in -\$791.00 went towards equipment, \$363.00 went to soup suppers income. Plans are to go ahead in May and June for Bible sticks. A food stand has already been built/donated and would be on our property. If anyone is interested in volunteering for this outreach, please contact the church office. Anniversary Celebration will be celebrated on November 3rd and possibly have one service on that date with a big breakfast/brunch. They have also been working on Halloween with possible Sock Hop after Trunk or Treat. Harvest Dinner is canceled this year due to the 70th Anniversary celebration. 
